## Seminars will include:

### **The Holistic Approach: Working Together**

Building on the seven pathways (as established by NOMS), this session explores how Prison Fellowship and Alpha for Prisons/CFEO are aiming to work together in the future

### **Alpha for Prisons**

Shows how the Alpha course can be adapted more effectively to suit the prison environment

### **Addiction Recovery**

The Recovery Course is part of the CFEO and Alpha for Prisons programmes and is a 16 week course which provides practical tools for supporting ex-offenders in breaking the cycle of addiction

### **Mentoring Ex-Offenders**

Part of the CFEO and Alpha for Prisons programmes; aimed at training mentors and addressing the challenges associated with mentoring ex-offenders on both sides of the prison wall

### **Introduction to Prison Fellowship's Programmes**

An introduction to the work that Prison Fellowship carries out on both sides of the prison wall

### **Sycamore Tree Programme**

An introduction to this highly successful Prison Fellowship programme, which aims to raise victim awareness among offenders and teach the principles and application of restorative justice

### **Working with Young Offenders**

Aims at covering issues related to working with and supporting ex-offenders who are under the age of 18

### **Working with Sex Offenders**

Equipping the work with this vulnerable group; helping to meet the needs of sex offenders whilst minimising the potential risk
